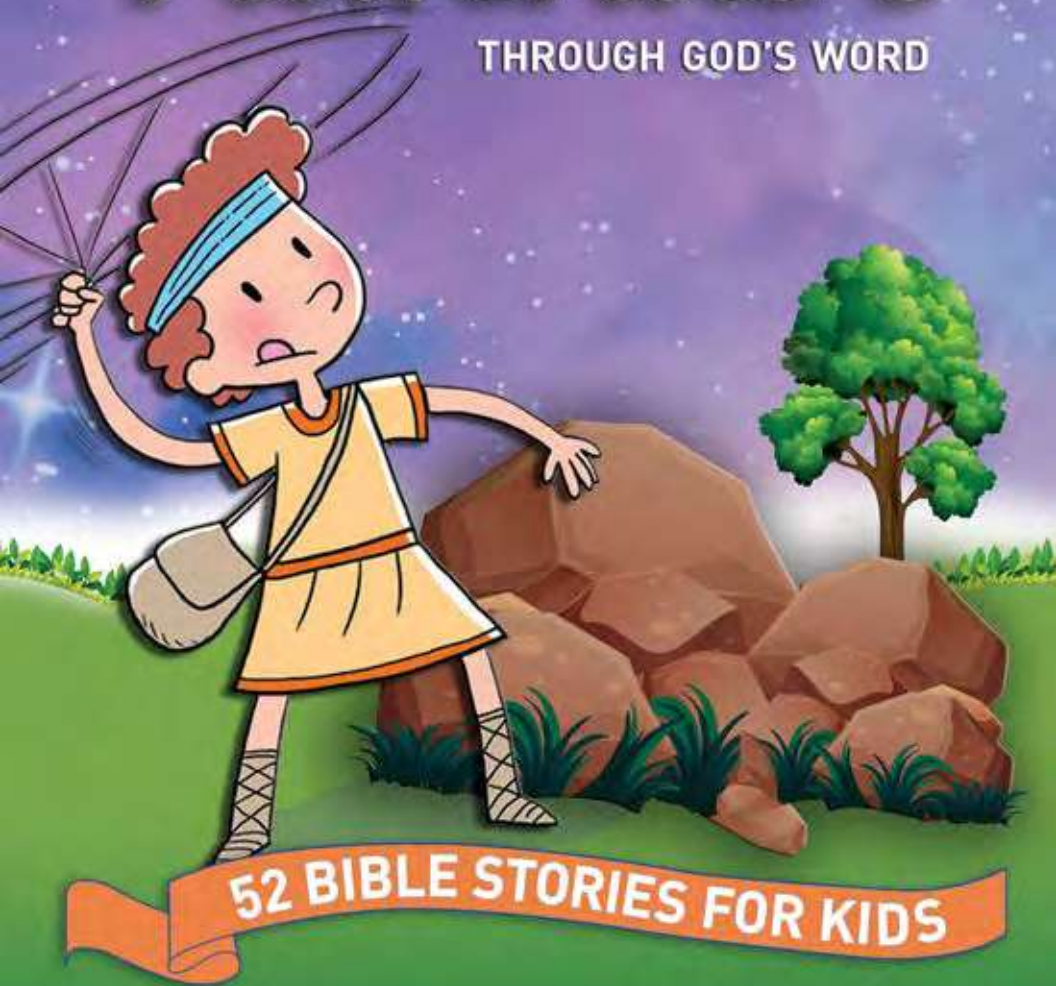

EXODUS 2:1-10

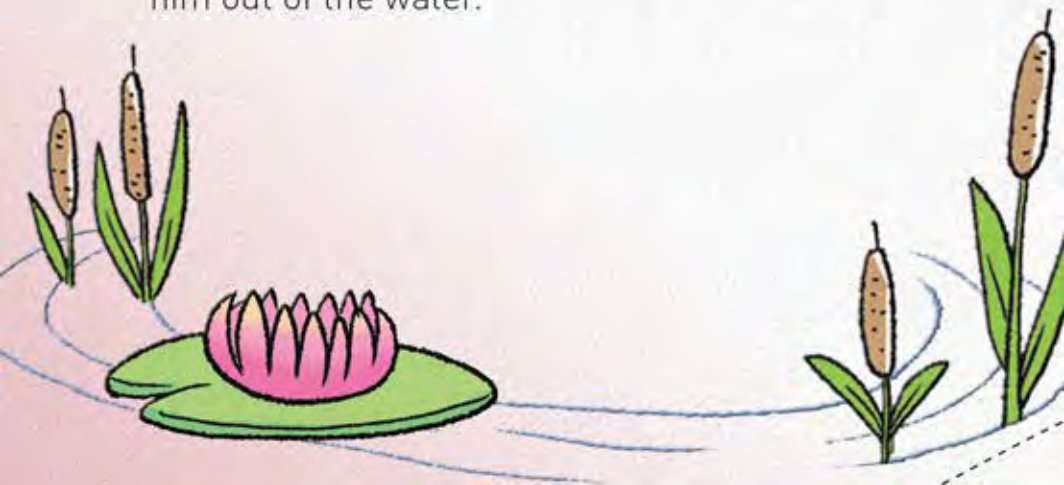
There was a man from the family of Levi. He married a woman who was also from the family of Levi. She became pregnant and gave birth to a son. She saw how wonderful the baby was, and she hid him for three months. But after three months, she was not able to hide the baby any longer. So she got a basket made of reeds and covered it with tar so that it would float. She put the baby in the basket. Then she put the basket among the tall grass at the edge

of the Nile River. The baby's sister stood a short distance away. She wanted to see what would happen to him. Then the daughter of the king of Egypt came to the river. She was going to take a bath. Her servant girls were walking beside the river. She saw the basket in the tall grass. So she sent her slave girl to get it. The king's daughter opened the basket and saw the baby boy. He was

crying, and she felt sorry for him. She



said, "This is one of the Hebrew babies." Then the baby's sister asked the king's daughter, "Would you like me to find a Hebrew woman to nurse the baby for you?" The king's daughter said, "Yes, please." So the girl went and got the baby's own mother. The king's daughter said to the woman, "Take this baby and nurse him for me. I will pay you." So the woman took her baby and nursed him. After the child had grown older, the woman took him to the king's daughter. She adopted the baby as her own son. The king's daughter named him Moses, because she had pulled him out of the water.



TODAY'S ADVENTURE

Joseph's father and brothers moved to Egypt to escape the famine. Their families grew and grew, and they were known as Hebrews. The Hebrews lived in Egypt for four hundred years. A new king, called the pharaoh, came into power, and he didn't know about Joseph and all he had done for Egypt, so he made all the Hebrews his slaves. To keep the Hebrew families from growing, he ordered that the Hebrews could not keep any baby boys that were born.

One Hebrew couple named Jochebed and Amram had a baby boy. They loved him very much and hid him for three months to protect him from the pharaoh.

When they couldn't hide him any longer, Jochebed made a floating basket, wrapped her baby in a blanket, and put him in the basket. She

took the basket down to the Nile River and placed it in the tall grass at the river's edge. Even though she was scared, Jochebed trusted God to take care of her son. His sister, Miriam, stayed by the river to make sure her baby brother was safe.

That day, the daughter of the mean pharaoh went down to the river to take a bath. She heard crying and saw the basket. She was very curious. She sent one of her slaves to get it. The princess opened the basket and was amazed . . . inside was a Hebrew baby!

Miriam then ran to the princess. She asked her if she needed a Hebrew mommy to take care of the baby. When the princess said yes, Miriam got her mommy. Jochebed was able to take care of her own baby!

When the little boy was old enough, Jochebed returned him to the princess. The princess adopted him and named him Moses. She named him Moses because she “lifted him out of the water.”
